## BRAZIL CUP OF EXCELLENCE AUCTION PRICES ARE HIGHEST EVER

The Brazilian Cup of Excellence 2021 auction, held online in December 2021, registered the highest average prices in history, both in Dollar and Real terms, reaching US\$ 14.83 per pound or R\$ 11,152.33 (US\$ 1,961.71) per 60-kg bag. The total revenue was R\$ 2,127,649.91 (US\$ 374,256.80), the highest amount in Reais since the first Cup of Excellence held in the country in 1999. The contest's winner coffee lot, produced by Fazenda Cachoeira, located in Carmo do Paranaíba in the Cerrado Mineiro region, received the highest bid of R\$ 49,600 (US\$ 8,730) per bag for the first lot and R\$ 45,900 (US\$ 8,069) per bag for the second one. ## (||) BRAZILIAN SHIPMENT DELAYS WILL LAST LONGER AND GENERATE REVENUE LOSSES

Although Brazil has overcome many logistics bottlenecks and exported 36.3 million bags from January to November 2021, generating a record revenue of US\$ 5.4 billion, the volume of coffee not shipped adds up to 3 million bags that are equivalent to an additional US\$ 500 million in export revenues. According to the Brazilian Coffee Exporters' Association (Cecafé), such a situation is not likely to be solved in the short term.

## (||) IMPACTS OF HEAVY RAINFALL ON COFFEE PRODUCTION

Heavy rains flooded coffee plantations in several Brazilian areas. Rainfall was four times above normal in the northern regions of Minas Gerais. Excessive rains cause immature coffee cherries to fall and production to be reduced. High moisture levels also prevent the use of good agricultural practices and cause the dissemination of pests and diseases. But unlike other climate impacts, extra rain can improve water conditions in coffee plantations. Extra moisture has improved conditions in other areas where rainfall is less intense, including the main coffee producing region, South Minas Gerais. Finally, intense rainfall may call for reinforcement in the application of fertilizers and benefit the 2023 crop.

#### ( BRAZIL WILL HAVE THE LOWEST CARRY OVER IN HISTORY

The National Coffee Growers' Council (CNC) pointed out that 2022 is expected to be a especially difficult year which prevents the sector from planning for the mid-term. Due to the adverse climate conditions, logistics uncertainty, lower production and especially the high costs of inputs, Brazil is expected to have its lowest carry over stocks in history by March 2022. The volume will be enough to supply the market but not much will be left.

## (||) BIOLOGICAL MANAGEMENT OF NEMATODES PREVENTS LOSSES IN COFFEE PLANTATIONS

According to research carried out by the São Paulo state Biological Institute, coffee productivity can be reduced by 20% due to nematodes. Integrated preventive management to control the incidence of nematodes includes sampling, resistant

varieties, crop rotation or intercropping, and biological control. The main infestations are of Meloidogyne sp. and Pratylenchus sp. phytonematodes, and the main species are M. incognita and M. paranaensis. These species affect the coffee root system by absorbing its water and nutrients, impact plant development and affect productivity. The dissemination of nematodes can occur by infested seedlings, floods, transit of agricultural implements with clods of soil containing nematodes, and transit of people.

#### (I) RECORD VOLUME OF COFFEE PRODUCTION IN ESPÍRITO SANTO STATE

In 2021 Espírito Santo coffee production faced good weather conditions in the Conilon producing areas and a not so favorable scenario in the regions where Arabica is grown. As a result, Conilon production grew much and accounted for a record of 11.2 million bags of green coffee. Conversely, Arabica production reached only 2.9 million bags of green coffee, representing a reduction of 38.2% compared to 2020. The state's total production reached a record volume of 14.2 million bags of coffee in 2021 but with an increase of only 1.5% compared to the 2020 harvest.



## (I)COFFEE IS FOURTH MOST VALUABLE BRAZILIAN AGRI-PRODUCT

The Gross Production Value (GVP) of Brazilian coffee reached R\$ 40.12 billion (US\$ 7.05 bn) in 2021. Arabica coffee accounted for R\$ 30,78 billion (US\$ 5.41 bn) and Conilon R\$ 9.34 billion (US\$ 1,64 bn), corresponding to 76.7% and 23.3% of the total, respectively. The coffee sector accounts for 5.3% of the total Brazilian agricultural production value and occupies the fourth place in the GVP ranking. The three products with higher GVP than coffee are soybeans, which accounted for 47.8%, corn 16.5%, and sugarcane 11.3%.
